Growing Better Connections - Nature Walk: - Tegryn

This is a 2.24 mile walk, which should take you about an hour. It's easy to find your way, with a series of 'Growing Better Connections' waymarkers along the route. It's a beautiful walk along bridle-paths and small roads, passing an impressive chapel, with panoramic views of the surrounding countryside. It can be a little wet and uneven under foot, so stout shoes are recommended.

- Start the nature walk at Canolfan Clydau,
- Cross the road and continue down the bridle-path directly opposite the hall,
- Follow the bridle-path, walking past Blaenffynnon, until you reach the chapel Llwynyrhwrdd,
- Turn right past the chapel onto a small 'yellow' lane. Walk up the lane until you reach a junction on the outskirts of Tegryn village,
- Take the left turning at this junction,
- Follow this lane, past a few houses until you reach a bridleway sign,
- Follow this path; walking past a couple of houses and through a gate. The path leads to the left of a 'lean-to' shed which houses free-range donkeys and sheep. Please make sure dogs are on leads at this point and you close the gate behind you,
- Follow this path until you reach a gate leading to Fronfedw Farm,
- Go through the gate, the path leads between the farm's buildings. A very friendly free-range dog lives here. So please make sure dogs are on leads, you close the gate behind you and remember not to deviate from the path,
- Continue to follow this path, past Dragons Lair, walking past the bridleway signs –
 there is a GBC way-marker here to direct you. Continue walking on this lane, until
 you reach the road,
- Turn right here and follow the lane until you reach the centre of Tegryn village,
- Take the left hand turning and then turn immediately right, the pub will be on your left-hand side. Follow this road; you'll walk past a post box and a cultural heritage information board, adjacent to terrace housing. Continue walking on the pavement, until you reach Canolfan Clydau and finish the nature walk!
